1. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 사용할 그래프를 고르시오. [1점]

M: Alice, did you finish the report?

W: Not yet. I haven't decided which graph I'll use.

M: Let me see. How about the line graph with dots?

W: I'm afraid it might not be good for my report this time.

M: Then, how about one of the bar graphs? They're a lot easier to understand.

W: That's what I'm thinking of. *[Pause]* Uh, which type do you think is better, horizontal or vertical?

M: To me, horizontal bars are not comfortable to look at.

W: OK. I'll take your advice.

M: I have one more suggestion. If the bars are connected with lines, you can also see the trends.

W: Good point. I'll use that graph this time.

3. 다음을 듣고, 무엇에 관한 설명인지 고르시오.

M: This is one of the ways you can save lives with a little time and courage. Today, many people are suffering because there isn't enough blood for medical operations. Before you do this, you'll surely be asked about your medical history and given a short physical examination. This procedure is needed not only for you but also for the person who will receive your gift. Blood will be drawn from you. And then, you'll get a certificate that you can use, just in case you might need some blood in the future.

4. 대화를 듣고, 남자가 여자를 위해 할 일로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Jane, why are you taking pictures of your computer?

W: I'm going to sell it on a website and buy a new laptop computer.

M: But this is still a nice one. How much are you going to sell it for?

W: Hmm.... I'm asking \$400.

M: \$400? That's not a bad price. *[Pause]* What about selling it to me for \$350?

W: Are you kidding? I bought this computer just a year ago, and it's still in good condition.

M: Well.... OK, I'll pay the price you want.

W: Thanks. Will you buy the printer, too? I'll let you have it for \$100.

M: Jane, I'm running low on money. What are friends for? I'll pay you half that price for the printer.

W: OK, OK. You win. It's a deal.

6. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.
