1. 대화를 듣고, 여자가 구입할 연필깎이를 고르시오.

M: May I help you?

W: I'm looking for a pencil sharpener for my daughter.

M: Okay. What about this house-shaped one?

W: I think it looks too plain.

M: Then, how about this train-shaped one? It's very popular with kids.

W: Hmm.... I don't see a handle. How does it work?

M: It's automatic. When you insert your pencil, it'll sharpen the pencil automatically.

W: It sounds convenient, but I think a manual one is more durable and can be used anywhere. *[pause]* How about that one?

M: You mean the train-shaped one with a handle?

W: No, the cat-shaped one. I think my daughter would like that one better.

M: It's a new model, so it's a little expensive.

W: She's going to love it. I'll take it.

W: That's not all. The growth potential of the company is really great. Its new products are very popular with consumers.

M: Sounds like the perfect job! I wish I could work in a place like that.

W: Yeah. I'm really happy there.

3. 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 주제로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Welcome back, class. Let's continue from where we left off. Now, would you start a five-mile run without stretching your feet, legs, and lower back muscles? Of course not. Then why would you start singing without loosening the parts of your singing mechanism? Like any other muscle in your body, your voice has to be warmed up before it can really operate at its best. The exercises you do to loosen your voice muscles are called vocal warm-ups. They not only serve to relax, loosen, and prepare the voice for singing, but they can also be used to overcome specific hurdles when developing good singing techniques.
